Jheronimus Bosch returns to the Prado's permanent collection with a new installation and monographic gallery.

MADRID. The exhibition to mark the 500th anniversary of Bosch's death, presented with the sole sponsorship of **Fundacion BBVA** and a final total of **589,692 visitors**. During the course of this week the triptychs by

Jheronimus Bosch

) in the

Prado

will return to the permanent collection for display in a special gallery now entirely devoted to the artist. This space will create the principal axis for a new installation of **15th- and 16th-century Flemish and Hispano-Flemish painting**

The events to mark the 500th anniversary of the artist's death will culminate with **the 6th Prado**

Chair

, for

which this year's holder,

Reindert Falkenburg

, will focus on

Bosch

and his most important follower,

Pieter Bruegel the Elder

(ca.1525-1569).

Outstanding loans, such as the ***Saint Anthony Abbot Triptych*** from the **Museu Nacional de Arte Antiga** in Lisbon, **C**

Christ carrying the Cross

from

Patrimonio Nacional

,

The Crowning with Thorns

from

the National Gallery

, London, and the drawing of the

Tree-Man

from the

Albertina

in Vienna, were seen in the exhibition alongside works from the

Prado

's own

collection of Bosch

, which is the largest and finest in the world and includes

The Garden of Earthly Delights

,

The Haywain

and

The Adoration of the Magi triptychs

. From this Friday these triptychs will be on display again as part of the permanent collection in

Room 56A

, which is now exclusively devoted to

Bosch

and has an installation that more clearly emphasises these works' nature as triptychs by allowing both the fronts and backs of the lateral panels to be seen.

Bosch's return to the galleries of the permanent collection will also be particularly interesting for young people taking part in the activity „Let's meet in the Prado”, aimed at 13 to 17-year-olds.

Regulating visitor flow

In response to the enormous interest that it generated from the outset, the measures implemented by the Museum for **Bosch. The 5th Centenary Exhibition**, including both timed entry slots for all tickets and longer opening hours, resulted in a balanced distribution of visitor numbers with very little difference between weekly numbers during the period that the exhibition was open.

Of the 589,692 visitors who saw **Bosch. The 5th Centenary Exhibition**, more than **182,000** purchased their tickets from **museodelprado.es**, pre-selecting the date and time of their visit. Weekly visitor numbers averaged **34,688**, with a daily average of **4,955**.

Bosch and the new installation

The new installation of **15th- and 16th-century Flemish painting** emphasises its principal exponents and **Bosch** is now the subject of a monographic gallery

(Room 56A)

, with another

(Room 55A)

devoted to

Joachim Patinir

(c. 1480-1524) and

Pieter Bruegel the Elder

. This new installation also places more emphasis on the Museum's magnificent but until now under-appreciated collection of Flemish painting from the second half of the 16th century, led by

Anthonis Mor

(c. 1517-1577) -

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These galleries are equipped with a modern LED lighting system recently installed in a new phase of the Museum's overall **project Lighting the Prado**, sponsored by **Fundacion Iberdrola**
